## My Future Fund - \$500 Savings account

My Future Fund is a new program for all 2nd-6t hgrade students who attend a participating Washtenaw County public school. All eligible students will receive an account with free money to jump start their savings for college and career training.

The program will also include free financial education and planning support. All eligible students will receive a \$25 deposit to start their account. Some students may qualify for an extra \$475 based on their family income.

## **Family Empowerment Program**



### What is the Family Empowerment Program?

The Family Empowerment program was created to provide individuals and families of the YHC with Individualized Supportive Services, which is done by working with our residents to promote self-sufficiency in three key areas – employment, education, and health/wellness.



### What can the FEP help with?

FEP staff have varying focus areas, ranging from mental health coordination, education and wellness, senior support, and permanent supportive housing. Available services are quite varied: FEP hosts 6 food pantries a month (Sauk Trail, Hollow Creek, Towner), provides GED courses, afterschool tutoring, transportation, game nights, community events, case management, mental health counseling, financial literacy, and referrals for furniture, home essentials, car repair, assistance with DTE bills, and much more.



### Who should I contact for support?

Each YHC community has FEP staff present. Listed below are the staff members in each community. In the event of a crisis, we encourage residents to contact any available FEP staff member in addition to appropriate first responders (EMT, fire department, police department, etc...).





## **Advance Ypsi Program Benefits**

Students who participate in Advance Ypsi will receive benefits to include, but not limited to:

- Support to determine career interests and goals as well as well exploration.
- Dedicated advisor and coach to support life issues that might arise and eliminate barriers to success.
- Expanded career opportunities through shadowing and engagement with local employers.
- Assistance with job applications, resumes and interviews.
- Potential paid internships, apprenticeships and job shadowing.
- Financial support for tuition, fees and equipment needed to be successful in the classroom and on the job.

## Cost and Available Financial Aid

Students enrolled in one of the Advance Ypsi programs, will be charged the per credit hour, in-district rate. For the 2023-2024 academic year, this cost is \$99 per credit hour.

To cover this cost, students are advised to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, FAFSA <a href="https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa">https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa</a>.

In addition, there are a variety of scholarships available <u>www.wccnet.edu/afford/financial-aid/scholarships/</u> to help you finance your education and reach your career goals. Free in-district tuition is available with the Michigan Reconnect Scholarship for eligible adults 25 and over to attend college.

## My Future Fund

Providing a jump start for students and families as they plan and save for college and career training.

Washtenaw Intermediate School District administers the My Future Fund program in collaboration with Washtenaw County Government. The money in My Future Fund Accounts will be held on behalf of students by the Michigan Education Savings Program and managed by TIAA-CREF Tuition Financing, Inc.



### What is My Future Fund?

My Future Fund is a new program for all 2nd-6th grade students who attend a participating Washtenaw County public school. All eligible students will receive an account with **free money** to jump start their savings for college and career training. The program will also include free financial education and planning support.

All eligible students will receive a \$25 deposit to start their account. Some students may qualify for an extra \$475 based on their family income.

## How do I get a FREE account? Accounts will automatically be activated for most

Accounts will automatically be activated for most students throughout the year. Look for more information and a login registration code when your child's account is ready.

Families who want to opt out of the program must complete an opt-out form.

## Do I need to share my child's social security number?

No. You do not need to provide a social security number or tax identification number.

#### What do I need to do?

To access the full benefits of the program, a parent or guardian should complete the short **Release of Information Form** to:

- Allow My Future Fund staff to check if your student qualifies for the extra \$475 deposit, based on family income.
- Receive information about upcoming opportunities and resources.
- Activate My Future Fund account if your student is on your district/school's directoryinformation opt out list.

## How can we use My Future Fund dollars?

After high school, My Future Fund dollars can be used for a variety of education expenses such as tuition, certain room and board expenses, fees, and the cost of books, supplies and equipment (including computers, internet access fees, software or printers) needed as part of the program at an eligible educational institution.
